Comparative Educational Studies was offered for the first time in 2004. So far more than 300 student teachers from Austria, Belgium, Czech Republic, Denmark, Finland, Germany, Kurdistan, Latvia, Ireland, Poland, Romania, Spain, Switzerland, Turkey, The Netherlands and the US have attended.



## **Comparative Educational Studies**

A Three Month 20 ECTS or One Semester (30 ECTS) Exchange Programme for International Students

Target group: Student teachers (Pre-school, primary and secondary school)

## Briet description ot the courses

#### EIS110 / Inclusive Education (8 ECTS)

This course provides a general introduction to the educational system in Norway and its traditions. Social inclusion is a core idea and the course takes a closer look at the concept of inclusive education. One week of observational practice give students the opportunity to discuss the strengths and limitations of the Norwegian system, compared to systems in their home countries.

### EIS120 / Music crossing Borders (6 ECTS)

This course focuses on areas of music making, active listening and composing, as approached through practical work with music from different cultures and through discussions relating to multicultural understanding. No previous musical experience is required.

# \* EIS155 / Drama in Early Childhood Education (6 ECTS) (optional)

This course will increase student's competence in planning and carrying out dramatic activity in early childhood settings (1- 6 year olds). Through active participation the students will achieve practical knowledge about dramaturgy, and develop further their ability in communication, interaction and acting.

# \* EIS150 / Migration and intercultural relations (6 ECTS) (optional)

This course has three subject areas: a.) Migration to and from Norway, past and present b) Education and migration: a European challenge c) Integration of immigrant children and families. Teaching methods include individual study, lectures, workshops, group work, excursions and school visits.

## EIS170 / School Experience (10 ECTS) (additional)

The 20 ECTS course Comparative Educational Studies can be extended with 20 days of practicum (teaching practice and/or fieldwork) and a written report.
